Easter Scavenger/Egg Hunt

Have kids and teens use their Bible and read the Easter story while hunting for eggs. Cut out each clue and hide inside an Easter egg. Have older kids help the younger ones. When there are multiple choices where to hide a clue, circle which one you want the children to look for. For the final clue, lead the kids to something that signifies the empty tomb. You can have an empty Easter basket, for example. Finish by talking about why the basket is empty. Make it more challenging by leaving out the answers. Teens can read the Bible passage and try to figure out where to go on their own.

1. The Triumphal Entry: Read Matthew 21:1-3 and Mt 21:6-9

(Find a donkey or other stuffed animal you can ride.)

2. Plot to kill Jesus: Read Mt 26:3-4 and Mt 26:14-16

(Find a place where money is kept)

3. The Passover Meal/Last Supper: Read Luke 22:14-20

(Find a place where you eat a meal)

4. Jesus prays: Read Mt 26:36-46

(Find a garden or place to pray)

5. Betrayal and arrest: Read Mt 26:47-56

(Find a Bible, where we can read that the scriptures were fulfilled)

6. Trial before Pilate: Read Mt. 27:15-26

(Find a place where you wash your hands)



7. Jesus Mocked: Read Mt. 27:27-31

(Find a robe)

8. Forgiveness: Read Luke 23:34-43

(Find straws or dice for casting lots)

9. Death: Read Mt 27:45-54

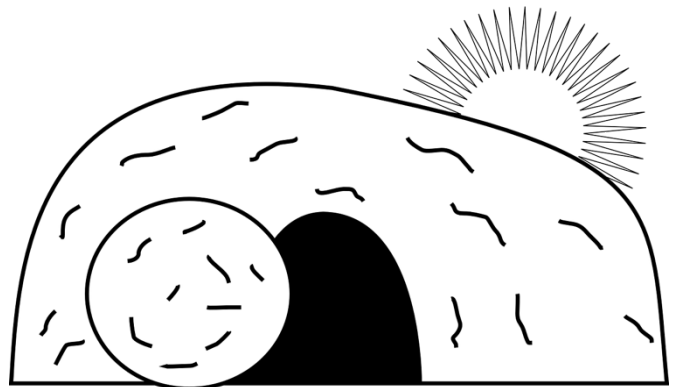
(Find a cross)

10. Burial: Read Mt 27:57-61

(Find linens)

11. Guard: Read Mt 27:62-66

(Find a soldier or a large rock)



12. Resurrection: Read Mt 28:1-10

(An empty tomb: Something empty)
